Genealogy For Beginners

Dick Sharpsten is generously donating his time to teach a class in Genealogy for beginners. This program is intended for those who are just starting their journey and want to know where to begin. Classes will consist of 3 sessions every-other week. The first session he will cover is getting familiar with the basic form and focus on the use of the “Family Group Sheet” as the primary tool, and begin exploring your own family. Second session will cover any problems that you encountered in using the “Family Group Sheet” and introduce the Pedigree Chart to begin organizing your data. It will also cover additional sources for obtaining information to explore such as obituaries, cemetery records, photographs, etc. From there he discusses interviewing family members and recording the information, as well as how to number sheets so they can be filed for easy retrieval. The final session will be held to answer any questions or problems that were encountered and review other sources for obtaining information such as reference libraries, federal and state census, probate court records, county land deeds and other records. Also he will provide suggestions on some available genealogy computer programs and show a sample of a shareware that he recommends.

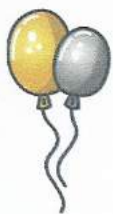

The Onondaga County Office for Aging is one of 59 Area Agencies on Aging in New York State and is part of the national aging network. Their aim is to be a focal point for information, advocacy, and coordination of eldercare services. Some of their services are listed below.

Caregiver Services - Provides respite programming, information and assistance, and support and discussion groups. It also offers the "Institute for Caregivers" – classes for current and future caregivers that inform on relevant topics.

Community Services - Provides information and referrals related to home repairs, legal services, senior center activities, health promotion initiatives, transportation options and shopping services. It also includes the Neighborhood Advisor Program.

Energy Programs - The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) offers heating and cooling assistance to income eligible seniors.

Health Insurance - The Health Insurance Information, Counseling & Assistance Program (HIICAP) offers free and unbiased information.

Home Care - Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP) - A sliding-scale, fee-based program that provides non-medical home care for frail individuals. It also includes case management and respite care options.

Nutrition Services - Provides nutritious meals and nutrition education through home delivered meals, senior dining sites and nutrition counseling. The unit also manages the annual "Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program."

NY Connects - Provides information and assistance on long term care services for persons of any age.

Long Term Care Services - Offers medically based home care for children and adults who receive Medicaid.

Neighborhood Advisor Program

If you are 60 years of age or older, you can receive assistance through the Neighborhood Advisor Program. Some available programs are Energy Grants (HEAP), Medicare, Financial Assistance, Medicaid, Health Services, Prescription Drugs, Home Care and Senior Groups. Legal Aid Society of Mid NY

Home Repairs

Project Fix is a small in-home repair service for senior citizens, 60 years and older living in Onondaga County. This is funded through Catholic Charities, NYS Office for Aging and Onondaga County Department of Adult and Long Term Care Services. They can help you with plumbing, electrical and carpentry services. Cost to you is materials and a donation for labor. Call Nancy Roberts at (315)362-7005.

Syracuse Call-A-Bus

Don't forget about this alternative for your transportation needs. Call-A-Bus is a paratransit service providing origin-to-destination trips to eligible people with disabilities who would otherwise use Centro buses if it were not for their disabilities. To determine if you are eligible for Call-A-Bus, you must complete a written application, and it must be signed and verified by a healthcare professional of your choice. This process may take several weeks. To request an application, please contact your local Call-A-Bus office Monday - Friday. 8:00 am - 5:00 pm. Fares range from \$2.00 to \$3.00. Your trip reservationist can tell you the exact rate of your trip at the time you make your reservation.
